

COVID 19 UPDATE – MARCH 3, 2022

As of February 28, 2022 the Government of Saskatchewan's Public Health Order have been lifted, removing any remaining provincially-mandated COVID-19 precautions such as masking, screening or capacity limits.

CFS Prince Albert encourages all staff and clients seeking our services to continue to implement health and safety precautions that promote and encourage a safe and accessible environment for everyone. To this end, the Board of Directors and management of CFS Prince Albert feels it is prudent to continue with the following:

Masking

Staff: All staff will be encouraged to wear masks.

Clients & Visitors: We will continue to make masks available to clients. Again, masking is encouraged but it is not mandatory.

Screening

We will no longer be asking staff and clients the COVID-19 screening questions. However, all staff and clients are encouraged to monitor symptoms before arriving at the office. If you are experiencing any COVID-19 symptoms including fever, cough, or loss of taste or smell we request that you stay home and reschedule your appointment.

Sanitizing

Ongoing and regular cleaning of all surfaces in the counselling offices, classrooms, washrooms and common areas will continue.

Physical Distancing

We are encouraging everyone to continue to respect social distancing as much as possible.

Remote & Telephone Services

Although the demand for in person services is increasing, we will continue to make telephone and virtual services available to our clients.
